Christmas on an African farm



At a time when getting and spending runs rampant – or next time you complain about the rain – it's worth remembering the Safari family in Kenya. I stayed with them on their subsistence farm recently.

The family have five acres, on which nine people subsist. They have maize, goats, chickens and one cow. That is, when it rains. Recently rain has become erratic – two years ago they lost most of their animals and their maize crop, and had to rely on emergency government rations. Last year the maize crop was poor, so they had to buy

maize seeds to plant this year. They have no running water or electricity. They badly need investment in a water tank and a pump to give them more water security for the dry times – but of course they don't have any money for such a big project – it would cost about £600. If any of you could help by giving a small amount they and I would be very grateful! These people have not created climate change – we, in the developed countries have – but there are millions of people all over Africa who are feeling the effects now. Please help.

Need help switching to digital TV?

TV is switching to digital all over the UK. Our area, the South-East, starts on 8 February 2012. If you don't have digital TV by the time of switchover, you will lose your TV channels. This can seem a bit daunting but there is help available for anyone who is over 75 and/or is disabled.

The BBC-run Switchover Help Scheme offers practical

help to convert one TV set to digital, including installation of the easy-to-use equipment, a demonstration of how to use it and 12 months of aftercare service including a free helpline.

If you are eligible you will have been sent a Help Scheme letter and information pack through the post. Most eligible people will be asked to pay £40

towards the standard option whilst those who are eligible and on income related benefits will get it free. If you want the help, you need to apply by telephoning the Help Scheme or completing the form.

Sky lantern lovely, or flying litter?




Many of us have released a Sky Lantern at a wedding, on Bonfire Night, Halloween, a birthday or on the anniversary of a dear friend's parting. When lit they can lift to over 1200ft and fly for up to 20 minutes. For the Chinese, they bring good luck, but here in the UK there are definite downsides. Once the fuel cell has expired they float back to earth, burnt out, leaving behind a

circular piece of wire about 15in across with two cross members. Perhaps we should all think before we buy sky lanterns. They may look beautiful in the night sky, but is it worth the risk to our environment and wildlife?

You have no control over the direction, height, distance or where the lantern will land – do you know who is going to pick up your litter? Birds, farm animals

and wildlife can accidentally eat the wire frames or become injured when they get entangled in the wire or bamboo-frames – only last month a farmer discovered a dead barn owl trapped in a lantern.

Airports have asked for a ban and both helicopter pilots and coastguards are reporting that they are hazardous and are being mistaken for rescue
