


Fulking's resident ghouls, ghosties and ghashlies certainly stepped up the intensity of their haunting and hunting activity this

It's on the Poynings website but Andy and Colin Warburton, who runs www.Poynings.net, generously agreed we could show it off in print for the benefit of Pigeon fanciers everywhere. What more talent exists round here?

Broadband, narrowband, no band at all?

Word has been coming in from a small but significant collection of villagers about what is going on – or not – with broadband in the area. Andrew Iversen, Tony Brooks, Damien McTernan, Bob Rowland, Geoff Bush and Colin Warburton who does the Poynings website (www.poynings.net) and email newsletter are all drawing attention to BT's grand claims about 'BT Infinity', the fibre optic upgrade to local exchanges that will allow download speeds up to 10 times faster than the current legal minimum, which is 2Mbps, or megabits (not megabytes, doh) per second. But – guess what – Poynings, as an exchange with less than 1000 users (369, to be

exact), doesn't qualify.

All is not lost. There are two things you can do. One is register your interest and vote for BT Infinity at www.bt.com/racetoinfinity. It won't mean you have to go with BT as your provider, just register with BT that there is a demand for better broadband in the area. You have until 30 December to vote, and at the last count only 25 votes were in, so get off your cyber-situpons and put your name where it counts. Now!

The other thing you can do, says Colin from Poynings, is: 'Complete a questionnaire that will enable us to build a case to put to BT Openreach and the Internet Service Providers,

on your behalf, to improve broadband in the county. Your role is essential to make sure that our voice is heard and that we are at the top of the queue when BT make the decision to improve broadband in West Sussex. They are looking for responses from the widest possible cross section, especially from two key audiences: those without any connection and small to medium size businesses.

Fill in the on-line questionnaire at www.westsussex.gov.uk/broadband. If you require an individual hard copy, call 01243 382147 and they'll send one to you. Take the time to complete it and help us get you connected!

National Trust Properties were asked to put forward projects which the public could then vote for. The top four or five would get a share of the £100,000. The Devil's Dyke wardening team has put a proposal together to improve paths and signage on Devil's Dyke, and restore the barn at Saddlescombe (pictured) which will provide an exhibition area on wildlife, history and land

There is to be a road closure at Edburton in front of 1, 2 and 3 School Cottages on 16, 17, and 18 November. EDF are planning to move the overhead electricity cables underground. **Lydia Bush**

Power cuts

If you get a power cut or reduced voltage (lights go dim), you need to ring EDF on 0800 783 8866 because they aren't always aware of the problem – and they need to be, because they have to physically come out to fix it. If enough people ring, EDF take it seriously. If power fails, turn off all non-essential items to reduce the power surge when the electrical power is restored. This includes computers.

When the lights dim as a

result of reduced voltage, first turn off your fridge, freezer, washing machine, computer, central heating... in fact anything that is working or could work automatically from a thermostat or time switch that has an electric motor which could burn out – as some did during the recent power fault. Be sure to leave one light on, so you know when the power is restored. **Tony Brooks**, Fulking Parish Council

Marking of footpaths

Some people have asked why they can't see the footpaths clearly. Paths are now being marked by running a quad bike across the ground to leave two tracks. The footpath is between the two tracks. But the ground was dry in early autumn so the marks didn't show up. The plan was for it to be done again when the ground is wetter so that the tracks show up more clearly. So keep your eyes open. No one would say it has been dry recently!

Mind the deer, dear

As winter takes hold, the Highways Agency and partners in The Deer Initiative are reminding drivers to watch out for deer, particularly at dawn and dusk. The Deer Initiative estimates that there could be up to 74,000 deer/vehicle collisions every year in the UK. Highest risk is in autumn and spring, particularly around dawn and dusk.

When you see deer warning signs, check your speed and stay alert. If your headlights are on, use full beam when you can. But dip your headlights if you see deer as they may 'freeze'. More deer may follow the first one you see. Be prepared to stop. Try not to suddenly swerve to avoid a deer. A collision with oncoming traffic or another obstacle could

be even worse. If you have to stop, use your hazard warning lights. Do not approach an injured deer, it could be dangerous. If you collide with a deer (or witness a collision) and someone may be injured, or if vehicles or deer in the road are a risk to road safety, then ring 999 for the Police or Ambulance. To report an injured deer ring the RSPCA 24 hours on 0300 1234 999.
