### **Spring in Fulking**

What an odd spring we have had! A cold and grey April, with daffodils out at the same time as primroses. Farmers experienced a three-week delay in planting as they could not take tractors into sodden fields. Villagers trying to grow plants for the May plant sale found their seeds reluctant to germinate. They eventually emerged and there was a good selection of vegetable and flowers for **Seedling Sunday** on May 6. Sadly we were lacking in visitors to consume the delicious cakes and buy plants. This was disappointing as it takes considerable time and care to produce plants and make cakes.

May proved a welcome contrast to April and everything seemed to burst into life at once, with amazing bluebells this year. Later the hedgerows were splendid with may blossom and cow parsley. As far as wildlife is concerned, this spring was a little disappointing. Nightingales have returned and are in good voice at Oreham Common and Woods Mill, but not in Fulking itself. Our neighbour tells us they used to sing in the orchard in Stammers Hill every spring, and were so noisy people used to throw shoes at them to shut them up! As Joni Mitchell once sang, ‘You don’t know what you’ve got till it’s gone’. Cuckoos have hardly been heard either. The weather is now fine and sunny, and hopefully we will have a great summer... ## **FULKING FAIR 2018**

This year's fair will be held in the North Town Field, Fulking, Sunday July 29, 12.00-17.00, and will incorporate the Allsorts Dog Rescue Fun Dog Show 12.30-15.00. Entrance and parking both free. There will be tea and cakes in the village hall as well as several local food stalls including Rushfields pies, Artisan Bakehouse bakeries, Fish Story fish & chips, French Revolution crepes, doughnuts, candy floss, gourmet foods and Mavis & Mike's ice cream.

Live music will include the Shoreham Allstars and Marta Scott dancers as well as local entertainers. The marquee will house a Shepherd & Dog bar. Children's events include pony rides, puppet show, bouncy castle, stocks, sand art, tattoo painting, coconut shy and Paws Animal Sanctuary games. Exhibitions and demonstrations include National Trust, Sussex Wildlife Trust, Tottington Woodlanders, Funjicolour spinners and weavers. Tombolas for adults and for children, and tug of war competition for all ages.
