Subscribe to the garden waste collection service to get a kerbside collection, from a wheeled bin once a fortnight.

The service is for all residents in the Mid Sussex area and costs £65 a year paid by direct debit.



Arrange for the collection of bulky and electrical waste, such as old furniture or appliances from your home. This is a chargeable service per item or set loading time.



We provide a free clinical waste collection service. It includes the provision of clinical waste sacks and/or yellow lidded sharps boxes for sharps such as epi-pens and diabetic syringes.



We offer assisted collection services for residents who are physically unable to take out their waste to the roadside. We can collect rubbish/recycling waste and garden waste if you have signed up to our garden waste service.
