Devil's Dyke Trail

Downland discovery

From the trail you can enjoy fine views of downland, farmland and sea. You are close to the old route of the Dyke Railway Branch Line, that opened in 1887. The line served the Devil's Dyke beauty spot and Brighton & Hove Golf Course and carried fodder and coal to local farms, returning to Brighton with hay. The Line was never very profitable and closed in 1938.

The Dyke Access Trail is a 2 km wheelchair-friendly, circular route, free of any steps or slopes and accessible for everyone. There are resting places every few hundred metres. The firm surface extends beyond this circular route to Devil's Dyke, Hangleton and Red Hill Car Park.



HOW TO GET THERE

Bus information: 77 from Rottingdean has easy access buses and space for one wheelchair. The 77 bus will stop on request at bus stops on route. Along Devil's Dyke Road it can be hailed and will stop anywhere that is safe. This includes the car parks at Dyke Approach, Boundary Halt and Poor Man's Corner.
