# VILLAGE HALL SAFE...

# ... at least for now. Jen Green reports on the latest PCC meeting, which outlined the hall's much brighter future

Thanks to your support, the future of the village hall is looking brighter than it has for years. In December 2011 the PCC (Parochial Church Council) declared its intention to close the hall which was little used and in poor repair, unless there was local enthusiasm to save it.

Villagers rallied round and an action group was formed. The Church agreed to keep the hall open for a trial year from February 2012, with a sixmonth review. The community gave generously to meet the £200-a-month running costs.

New, regular groups such as a toddler group, youth club and yoga started, and events such as Fulking's Got Talent and Seedling Sunday proved a great success. The hall was repaired, redecorated and made welcoming.

At the recent six-month review meeting on 2 October the mood was optimistic. The PCC acknowledged that community support has indeed been found to pay running costs, keep the hall in good repair and use it much more fully.

From February 2013 the PCC

will ask for a small donation of £30 per month on top of running costs. This is much less than a 'rent' that had previously been discussed, and running costs are also likely to be lower than expected. The PCC agreed to keep the hall open for another year and hopefully into the future. Details of our agreement have still to be fine tuned, but the future of Fulking's only communal space is looking much more secure.

None of this would have happened without community support. The hall committee would like to thank ALL who have given money / set up standing orders, donated equipment, helped with maintenance, and contributed ideas and enthusiasm.

With your support we will continue to meet costs and set up a small contingency fund for essential repairs which we cannot do ourselves. We welcome suggestions for new groups and events for 2013 and beyond! Note that the hall is also available for private events.

And a special Fulking thanks to Jen, Nick and Tricia for all their hard work at VHAG!

Having watched Oz Clarke and James May back in 2008 on TV touring the country looking at small micro-breweries, says landlady Jenny Tooley, we thought about brewing our own ales - and to add a unique touch, we would use the spring water from the stream in the pub garden. The outcome was 'Ruskins Ram' best bitter. At this time brewing was taking place in Kent using another brewer's site, but so much interest was shown in the 'Ruskins Ram' and Widdi our head brewer had so many ideas for new ales, we realised we'd need our own equipment and site.

We opened our new brewery in Small Dole on 29 September and Widdi had an excellent range of ales brewed for visitors to sample including the latest addition, 'Three Rings'. All the ales are named after local connections; Ruskins Ram, Devils

Dyke, Truleigh Gold and our yetto-be-named Christmas Ale. The designs for the pump badges, again keeping it with a local feel of a signpost and background of the South Downs, are by Fulkingite Adrian Caroen.

There was also a rather special treat waiting for another one of our locals, Lee Holden – a box of ale made using hops he'd picked from his garden and given to Widdi to make a brew. Named 'Green Hops', it's currently on sale in the pub if you'd like to try it.

As well as the ales, a new batch of cider will be on its way soon, hopefully not as strong as last year's! A date for our charity cider night has yet to be set but will be advertised on our website www.shepherdanddogpub.co.uk in due course.


We are becoming a musical pub! Yes, several nights leading up to Christmas are 'music nights', kicking off on Friday 19

Residents can now view their council tax bills online by signing up to a new electronic billing service from Mid Sussex District Council. It's completely free and means that instead of receiving a traditional paper bill, you get it emailed as a PDF (like PP). Use the online system, save paper and protect the environment.
