Winter wisdom

Do's:

- Follow the Parish Winter Management Plan.
- Move snow to a porous surface such as a grass verge or garden.
- Spread salt/grit evenly and at appropriate spread rates.
- Spread salt/grit before frost.
- · Clear any excess salt or grit once the snow/ice has melted.
- Inform the Parish Clerk if grit is running low.
- •Look out for your neighbour. Don'ts
- Use water to melt snow and ice
- if there is a risk it will refreeze. • Move snow where it will create another risk such as where

people are likely to walk.

Ash dieback



Our local tree warden Barry Leppard warns of the spread of Chalara Fraxinea, a fungus causing leaf loss and crown dieback in ash trees which may well lead to the death of the affected tree. It hasn't been found in the natural environment in the UK yet, although a shipment of trees from Europe was recently found to be infected. Leaves suffer from wilting and black-brown discoloration, the entire crown can show leaf loss and dieback, lens-shaped lesions appear on the bark and shoots and twigs are also affected.
