

Fulking Village Hall One Year On

The First of February marks the first birthday of the Village Hall in its current manifestation.

It's been exactly a year since villagers took over management of the Hall from the Church PCC, with responsibility for paying running costs estimated at £200 a month.

And what a year it's been! With generous help from villagers, we have been able to meet running costs and even start a contingency fund for essential repairs. The Hall, which was practically unused this time last year, is now in very regular use, with groups such as Yoga, Mother and Toddler, Games Evenings and Youth Club taking place weekly or regularly. With the help of our resident DIY experts and an enthusiastic working party, the Hall has been redecorated and maintained inside and out and is now clean, shiny and much more welcoming, with new chairs courtesy of Fulking Social Committee. We have also received a grant from West Sussex County Council to replace all six windows.

In the year since February 2012 we've held a number of highly successful events in the hall. Fulking's Got Talent, Seedling Sunday, Card-making Day, Call My Bluff Wine Quiz and the Christmas Bazaar were all great successes, both as social events and fund-raisers. The Hall is also regularly used for private parties, our own Fulking Christmas parties and for Parish Council and planning meetings. Three very well-attended defibrillation training sessions were recently held in advance of the defibrillation machines being installed outside the Hall and at the pub. More, bigger and better events are planned for 2013 watch this space!

Don't forget the Hall is available for use by villagers for the knockdown price of just £1 per villager per session or £10 per hour for non-Fulking / Edburton residents. To book contact Carolyn Loveless, preferably by email, on ci@ rogerl53.plus.com or call 280.

All in all, it's safe to say that the Village Hall is in much

better nick and in better heart one year on. The PCC has been pleased with progress and the future of the Hall seems more secure. A big thank you to all who have donated equipment and contributed ideas and enthusiasm.

All that said, we do need your continuing support

to meet running costs and undertake repairs. A special thank you to all who set up a standing order this time last year - that regular money has been absolutely invaluable. New standing orders would be more than welcome - just £5 or £10 a month will genuinely make a real difference. Fulking's defibrillators That's the people as well as the machines...

This is an edited version of the story that appeared in the West Sussex County Times on 4 February. Fulking's Tricia Robinson, a health visitor, nurse and midwife for 42 years - and based at Henfield Medical Centre since 1986 - has co-ordinated the defibrillator training for the two defib machines recently installed in the village - one in the porch of the Village Hall Chapel, and one in the Shepherd & Dog. Tricia's daughter Lucie died, aged 24, two years ago after a Sunday morning emergency in which she was revived by Tricia - but sadly died a week later. 'It has been since then I have wanted as many people as possible to be trained in

resuscitation techniques,' says Tricia.

Tricia, who has lived in Fulking for 22 years, has given money in Lucie's memory

for the defibrillator cases and villagers have also raised funds. HART (Henfield Area Response Team) founder Dave Fletcher, an award-winning paramedic, took the classes over three weekends at the Village Hall, assisted by other HART responders. 'Tricia and the people of Fulking have shown great initiative and the defibrillators will be ideally



located in this remote area,' says Dave. 'Being able to use defibrillators is a major step in helping where heart failure has occurred.' People living in Edburton and Poynings will also benefit. A big thank you, says Tricia, to HART for giving us the defibs, maintaining them, and training so many of us. Anyone can use them, trained or not. Tricia Robinson, 255
