Brighton City Singers

One of the fair's musical high points will be the Brighton City Singers, a collection of enthusiasts who have been known to number 200 or more. In 2009, the Singers sang at Royal Festival Hall in London, as well as raising money for Anchor House and the Brighton and Hove Samaritans. If that wasn't all, the choir sang the vocal track for the documentary 'Wild Ocean', an IMAX documentary about

whales, written and produced by the dance group STOMP, with worldwide distribution.

For seven years running, the choir has taken part in the Brighton Festival Fringe. In May 2009, the Brighton City Singers performed alongside the South London Choir, musical director MJ's London-based ensemble, in a concert of entirely new choral music, giving composers, singers and musicians the opportunity to create original choral music and

have it sung and heard in public. The show was titled 'Sex & Drugs & Rock'n'Roll...Oh Yeah!', arranged and directed by MJ.

Hedges, nesting birds and dogs...

The Parish Council would like to remind everybody about their responsibility towards wildlife, particularly at this time of the year.

This is the time of year when everything starts growing madly, and as a consequence, this is when we start pruning and trimming to make our gardens look their best.

However, please spare a thought for our wildlife, in particular the birds. This is the season when they have already chosen their nesting sites and are bringing up their chicks; taking down or hard pruning of established hedges and trees

can be disastrous for them. Using electric hedge trimmers for prolonged periods can scare away the parent birds, meaning abandoned nests and chicks. If possible, try to plan hard pruning before 1 March and after 31 July at the earliest - ideally end of August – and keep tidying to a minimum during these times. Many birds have two or three broods, especially if weather conditions are adverse.

It is actually an offence under Section 1 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act of 1981 intentionally to take, damage or destroy the nest of any wild bird while it is in use or being built -

for example, if you know there is an active nest in the hedge and still cut the hedge, damaging or destroying the nest in the process, you are in contravention of the law.

We also need to be aware of ground nesting birds, such as skylarks, pheasants and meadow pipits, when walking our dogs, especially when walking through 'open access land' (in our area Fulking escarpment and the north face of the Downs). From 1 March to 31 July, dogs must be kept on a short lead on open access land to protect these ground nesting birds. At all times of the year, dogs should

be kept on a short lead when in the vicinity of livestock. We are seeing an increasing number of incidents on Fulking escarpment where dogs chase cattle and sheep and the owners are unable to call them back under control. As a reminder, farmers are within their rights to shoot dogs which are worrying their livestock.

We live in the countryside. and wildlife and livestock are a large part of this. We as residents should try to set an example and politely remind the visitors who use and enjoy this beautiful area of their responsibilities towards it. Then we can all enjoy it including the birds.

Grow your own orchard

Sussex Broadband - hope springs eternal

From WSCC, April /May 2013: 'We are delighted to announce that we have signed a contract with BT Telecommunications PLC to transform broadband speeds across West Sussex. Fibre broadband will be rolled out to around 98 per cent of West Sussex homes and businesses within the next three years, following a multi-million partnership project between West Sussex County Council and BT. The Better Connected West Sussex Broadband project builds on BT's on-going commercial fibre deployment across the county, and will provide broadband infrastructure to over 44,000 premises with superfast speeds of at least 24Mbps by Spring 2016. We anticipate that our target of 90% of premises at superfast speeds will be exceeded once the project is complete. On completion of the roll-out, the aim is for all premises within West Sussex to receive a minimum of 2Mbps but with a vast majority achieving speeds well in excess of this.

Jen Green reported that we made £148 at Seedling Sunday from plants and teas (donations were not requested).


