West Sussex Volunteers needed to help older people in

Royal Voluntary Service (formerly WRVS) is calling on local people to dedicate a couple of hours a week to help older people in their community. The charity's Community Meals on Wheels service provides older and housebound residents with much more than a hot meal; the service is a source of vital social

contact for people who might not otherwise see anyone else from one week to the next. Royal Voluntary Service volunteers also perform 'safe and well' checks to make sure the older people who use the service have everything they need to stay safe, healthy and independent in their own homes.

David McCullough, Royal Voluntary Service Chief Executive, said: 'This is a really vital service for older people in the community. Taking someone to the shops or having a chat may not seem like much, but it makes a massive difference to the older people who use the service. Our volunteers are

2) Meanwhile, look seawards to find the Director of Planning for the South Downs National Park, Tim Slaney, saying: 'The Rampion wind farm proposals would harm the landscape and cultural heritage of the South Downs National Park, introducing 175 turbines into the iconic views from the Sussex Heritage Coast and cause large scale disruption to the landscape of the National Park through the construction of a 14km long and 30m wide cable corridor.
