Assuming we get no more than five nominations, those two plus another three will automatically become Councillors, because there will

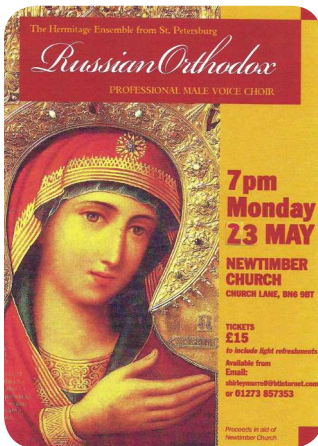

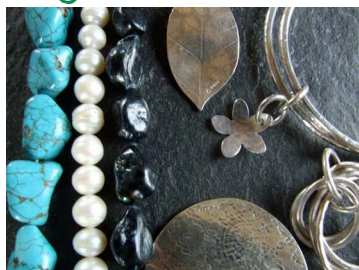
