

The cost of Fulking's three from the PC coffers alone. Paula will be on the agenda fo

The cost of Fulking's three street lights used to be offset from 'cross subsidy' from larger councils, but that stopped in 2008. Since then EDF has doubled its charges. In less than three years the annual cost of the lights has gone from £100 to over £650 – not sustainable

from the PC coffers alone. Paula Hazard, our redoubtable and resourceful Clerk to the Parish Council, found an electricity supplier with no standing charges (more than 2/3 of the current EDF bill). This means the street lights will stay on as the budget will cover the cost. The subject

will be on the agenda for the next PC meeting on 13 January, as since the energy companies continue to whack up their bills, turning the lights off could become a live issue again.

And – Paula found someone to repair the street light at Stammers Hill which is now fixed.

Below, the Parochial Church Council (PCC) discusses plans for the Village Hall site, asking for your views about where you think a new Village Hall should

be located. This is one of the first actions arising out of our work so far! It's really important that you let the PCC know what you think, so please do email Caroline.

#### ...as part of whi ch, what do you think about lage

It may come as a surprise to many in the village to know that what most people call 'The Village Hall' is in fact owned by the Church. The Parochial Church Council of St Andrew's in Edburton (known as the PCC - not to be confused with PC for Parish Council) is responsible for the upkeep of the Hall and for decisions about its future. For some years now the Hall has run at a loss, subsidised by the PCC. The building is now outdated and rather run down, to the extent that some major decisions have to be taken. Although some short-term improvements will be made immediately for the current tenants (The Good Start School), it's clear that the site needs to be completely redeveloped over the next few years.

The PCC has identified two ways forward: sell the site for redevelopment, or retain it and build a new Hall together with other facilities, for use of church and community. As we would be losing the Chapel / Reading Room, we would want to include in any plans a small adaptable space for church use - such as meetings with couples to discuss weddings or baptisms. Any redevelopment would of course be sympathetically designed to blend with surrounding buildings.

The decision between these two options will be made by the PCC based on a number of factors - one of these is what

local residents want. Asking your views on this issue is one of the main action points in the Fulking Village Action Plan (see the section on Community and Leisure). So please do let us know what you think:

Is a Hall in the centre of the village something that you would like to see retained? We'd love to hear from you.

### a bit of a grin they might need to be installed a From street lights to grit bins:

The grit bins are coming! A new grit bin will be installed near the junction of Clappers Lane and The Street. Jenny Vaughan paid for it as a leaving gift to the village. This should be in place soon. The PC were going to request bulk bags of grit for other problem areas but

have decided to go for a more permanent solution and have ordered four more grit bins.

Three will be sited in problem areas in Clappers Lane and one will be positioned near the Shepherd & Dog. Installing these might take a bit longer. Apparently grit bins get stolen so bit more securely than the one in The Street.

When you get over a foot of snow you need more than grit, so the PC is trying to restore the old system where the County Council had an agreement with local farmers to clear the snow

from lanes. This has been agreed in principle with the local farm -Perching Manor Farm – and West Sussex County Council. However, the village is too small to afford its own snow plough so we are trying to borrow one from the Council. Think we might have found one! Paula Hazard
