Our New Improved Children's Playground!

Our project to improve Fulking Children's Playground has received £5,000 from Viridor Credits Environmental Company, through the Landfill Communities Fund for a new safety surface. The grant, combined with the village's great fundraising efforts, has funded a new rubber surface, proper concrete edging and returfing.

Local parents and grandparents, including Tricia

Robinson our local Health Visitor, are delighted – no more bark bits in little eyes, or finding their way into washing machines! Tricia says her little grandson loves going to the playground and finds the new surface much easier and safer to get around on. It also means lower maintenance costs for the village. A spring celebration, including an Easter Egg Hunt, to officially open our new improved playground, is on Good Friday, 22 April; we are hoping a certain

local 'celeb' will help with that. Viridor Credits Environmental Company distributes funding through the Landfill Communities Fund. Funding is available for community and environmental improvement projects within 10 miles of an active Viridor Waste Management landfill site. Since 1996 Viridor Credits has allocated over £70m to over a thousand projects across the UK.

People might be mistaken for thinking that Fulking is the location for a new version of Wind in the Willows, but sadly our ratty visitors don't have Equity cards and are causing quite a nuisance for some residents on The Street. Whilst rats are part of country life, as one of us found recently, having a not-so-small brown fellow romping on your living room rug isn't the best of Valentine's Day presents. Rats love lurking in undergrowth and debris as well as any food sources, so everyone is asked to help minimise the rat population by:

- Checking undergrowth near houses and keeping it cleared out and tidy.
- Clearing outside areas of debris

and 'stuff' (even non-food items).

- Making sure that bird feeders are rat proof and don't drop excess seed etc. on the ground below, and are situated away from the house.
- Making sure that all rubbish is in the wheelie bins and that the lids are closed.

Egg language


