



MSDC 'Waste less' Challenge

Mid Sussex District Council is inviting denizens to take up a 'Waste Less' Challenge. It divides into the 'Waste Less to Landfill Challenge' and the 'Waste Less Energy Challenge'. (www.midsussex.gov.uk/page.cfm?pageID=8593)

The 'Waste Less to Landfill Challenge' is to see how empty you can get your landfill bin. By reducing the amount of waste sent to landfill you help to reduce the release of methane. You record what you throw away for a week and then follow some tips to see how much you can reduce the amount you throw away the next week. To help we are offering a pack of things to help with waste reduction to the first 20 people to sign up to the challenge. If you enter this challenge and return your

summary sheet you'll be entered into a free draw to win a Green Johanna food waste digester (www.greencone.com).

'The 'Waste Less Energy Challenge' is to see how much you can reduce your electricity demands. Record how much energy you use / how often you use appliances. To help we are offering FREE Current Cost meters to the first 20 people to sign up to the challenge. If you enter and return your summary sheet you will be entered into a free draw to win a solar powered charger.'

Two matters of note appear this month, connecting us to Fulking's shared experience of years gone by (it seems that we're strong on the 20th century but I haven't come across anything earlier yet - can anyone shed any documented light on local history of the C19 or before? - Ed): the Village Archive, whose quaintly beautiful title page is reproduced at left, and above, the mysterious WWII story of the crash-landed German bomber, a Junkers JU88, which apparently came down at Wickhurst Barns.

The Archive first, since Linda and Terry Harris, who are now its proud and reponsible keepers, are looking for contributions about matters old and new. It was started in 1947 as part of a 'Village Scrap Book' competition organised by the West Sussex County Federation of Women's Institutes. The cover is a tour de force of embroidery, stitched by a lady of 81 years, we are told, without the help of spectacles.

Contents include hand written memoirs from members of old Fulking families, a strangely moving page from Mr PW Lucas, who arrived at Fulking Post Office and Stores in 1897 as a 12-month old baby and who lost his airman son to the war in 1939 – shortly after he had won a Gold Medal for his Hovis bread – photos and drawings of village houses and all manner of things besides.

This is what Linda and Terry say: 'The Village Archive is being brought up to date. However, "The Keeper of the Archive" would like to know if there are hidden treasures tucked away. If you do have anything of interest

about Fulking, Edburton or the Dyke/Downs, please drop them down to 39 Clappers Lane or leave a message on 857486. If anything is too precious or fragile it can be photocopied and the source will of course be shown in the Book.'

It so happens that Linda and Terry are the source for the Junkers story as well (the pic is just a general one, not the specific plane in question), from a book called 'Blitz Over Sussex 1941 - 42' by Pat Burgess and Andy Saunders. 'On the night of the 1/2nd June 1941,' they explain. 'a Junkers 88 was shot down at Wickhurst Barns. All the crew baled out. Two were captured quickly, one was killed in the crash and one other was found next day on the Downs - his parachute had failed to open.

'The interesting thing here is that two machine guns were pinched from the aircraft in spite of a police presence. Who were the five locals seen cycling away with a heavy sack and one machine gun?' Rich pickings indeed, and one is put to ponder about who those five could have been, and who they would be in modern day Fulking.

Tony Brooks has an angle: 'I know of this story, as one of the "borrowers" told it to me. The flying jacket kept him very warm through the winters. I chickened out of putting all the details in my book, just merely mentioned where it had crashed.

'During the war... censorship was very strong. If you or I had obtained film and taken a picture we would have immediately been locked up and accused of spying...'
