SUMMER 2019 NEWS Mayfield Market Town Proposal

Miles Firth, Chair of Fulking Parish Council, draws our attention to the Mayfield Market Town proposal, which is now before Horsham District Council. This proposal is for a town of 7,000 new homes (20,000 people) within half a mile of the Henfield boundary in the Wheatsheaf Road area. After rejection by Mid-Sussex District Council, Horsham District Council are now being targeted, and are under pressure to provide new homes in their region. Should this go ahead, not only will the impact on Henfield be enormous, but also on the surrounding area in terms of stretched resources, increased traffic etc. Fulking Parish Council will note the general sentiment and provide feedback to HDC as an adjoining parish under their Community Involvement Policy.
