Fulking Parish Council News by Mark Hind, Chair of Fulking PC

A lot is going on in our village at the moment and
below is an update on some hot topics:

Downlands School Allocations

After a campaign last year, we managed (with the
help of our County and District Councillors) to

get West Sussex County Council (WSCC) to
allocate places at Downlands school for children
who had previously had their applications
rejected. One family this year also had their
application refused and sought help from
ourselves for the appeal. I am pleased to say that
WSCC have now also changed their mind and
allocated a space. However, the fact remains that
residents are being initially refused their first
choice of Downlands school, which is creating
unnecessary anxiety for local families. We will be
discussing school allocations at our next Parish
Council meeting on April 7 at 7.30pm in the
Village Hall. I would encourage people to attend
so you have an opportunity to express your views
directly to County and District Councillors.

Full Fibre Broadband Scheme

Although by the February 25 closing date, we
achieved 100% of our target unfortunately a
number of the pledges made were not valid and
we are now short of the number required for the
scheme to go ahead. Thankfully Openreach have
agreed to extend the deadline so we can get more
pledges. The pledge site remains open ([https://
www.openreach.com/connectmycommunity](https://www.openreach.com/connectmycommunity)) so
we would ask anyone who has not made a pledge
yet and has received a letter from us inviting
them to do so, to pledge now.

Village Hall Update

A public meeting was held on December 4 2021
where a proposal to set up a Village Hall Trust to
buy the land and hall from the Church for £75k
was presented and discussed. At the end of the
meeting a vote was taken and 80% of attendees
voted in favour of proceeding with the proposal.
Plans to launch the fund-raising campaign are on
hold at the moment awaiting formal approval
from the church to proceed with the sale. In the
meantime, a Fulking Village Hall Trust is being
set up which will be the best way to raise funds
and secure the hall for the community.

Road Closures

We recognise it is necessary to close roads from
time to time, however the recent situation where
WSCC shut two out of the three roads from our
village was unacceptable. The PC raised this with
WSCC and we are hopeful that they will take
action to stop this occurring in future.

Ladybrook Spring

Those of you who use Edburton Road will have
noticed that Ladybrook Spring continues to flow
across the road despite the drain cleaning that

was undertaken last year. Following pressure from the PC I am pleased to advise that WSCC have just confirmed approval of capital expenditure in this year's budget to undertake permanent repairs.

Queen's Jubilee Green Canopy

You may have noticed a new tree in the North Town Field close to the playground. This tree was planted on March 26 as part of the 'Queen's Green Canopy', a nationwide initiative created to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee this year. The West Sussex Association of Local Councils has encouraged every town and parish council to plant at least one tree in its community and we were keen to play our part. I am pleased to say the North Town Field Trust approved our request to plant the tree and Tricia Robinson, Chair of the Trustees selected an apple tree called 'Red Windsor' also known as 'Sweet Lilibet', which fits the bill perfectly.

Rural housing support grants

I understand that the government is proposing an annual grant of 20% of the rateable value of rural housing for properties with four or more bedrooms. This will be the cornerstone of 'Levelling up' to ensure that the responsibility of maintaining a large rural property is rewarded. As yet it is not quite clear how this will be implemented for billionaires, but some sort of compensation for their contribution to society will have to be found to allay public sentiment. Of course, if this comes to fruition it will form a major part of the Conservative manifesto at the next General Election. In the event that this will cause a surge in the demand for larger properties, a 'help to buy' scheme will be instigated, but only for taxpayers in the 40% bracket of income tax. (1.4.22)
