Parish Council News by Mark Hind, Chair of Fulking Parish Council (PC)

Local Government Elections Mid Sussex Local Government Elections will be

held on Thursday 4 May. Mid Sussex District Council (MSDC) are implementing new electoral boundaries. Fulking Parish will come under a new electoral area known as Downland Villages Ward, with one District Councillor representing the ward on MSDC. Residents will be able to vote for District Councillors on 4 May.

In addition to the District Councillor, Fulking has five Parish Councillors who represent the community in dealings with MSDC, West Sussex County Council, the South Downs National Park Authority and the Police. If you would consider taking on a public service role and representing your community you can put yourself forward to be a Parish Councillor. For more information see: https://

Potholes and flooding

Most of the roads within West Sussex are the responsibility of West Sussex County Council

(WSCC). Unfortunately, due the extremely wet and cold weather this winter the number of potholes and floods on our roads increased dramatically. Although the potholes and flood close to the Shepherd and Dog were reported by the PC early in December it has taken WSCC until this month to undertake remedial work, as they have worked through their backlog. The PC continues to put pressure on WSCC to undertake faster and longer lasting repairs and to keep our local roads in good repair. I would also encourage residents to report issues directly to WSCC via their website:
