#### Parish Council News by Mark Hind, Chair of Fulking Parish Council (PC) Local Government Elections

I'd like to thank Karen Healy, Lucy Mehta and Tom Kardos for putting themselves forward to be Parish Councillors for the next four-year term. I was elected again as Chairman at the Annual Meeting of the Council on May 18, and so I am pleased to be serving the community again for the next four-year term. Also, I would like to thank Linda Dyos, who has just stood down as a Parish Councillor after eight years, for her hard work and dedication to supporting our village. We wish her all the best for the future and continued progress in her recovery from her unfortunate accident which occurred over the Christmas period.

We are looking forward to working with Geoff Zeidler, the newly elected District Councillor for our Downland Villages ward. Geoff worked hard to engage with our community prior to his election, and I am sure his experience, including previously being Chair of LAMBS (Local Against Mayfield Building Sprawl) will be invaluable to us as we seek the support of Mid Sussex District Council and the South Downs National Park Authority to help our village.

### Full Fibre Broadband Scheme - Update

Installation started in January and many properties now have access to Superfast Broadband. It is anticipated that installation will be complete across the whole of the village by the end of the summer.

### Playground

The Parish Council owns the playground equipment in the North Town Field, and as part of the insurance arrangements Councillors undertake a two-weekly safety check. In addition RoSPA Play Safety undertake an annual safety inspection with the next one due in June/July. Unfortunately, as the equipment is aging, an increasing number of repairs are being required. We are to seek the help of MSDC to see what support/grants may be available to assist with the rapidly increasing costs.

Well, spring finally arrived! At present it is at its best with may blossom, chestnut candles and buttercups. The rapeseed has flowered, and there are beans growing in the field below the North Town Field. I suppose we have got used to the intrusive buildings related to the sewage works at the bottom of the field, and hopefully they won't be there for too much longer. Let's hope this summer is not as dry as the last. Not much drama here in Fulking that I know about! Fair preparations are continuing under the guidance of Sallyann, and we are slowly working towards the purchase of the village hall. Preparations are also underway for an art exhibition in Poynings church on June 24/25. I am sure we are all enjoying the warm, sunny weather and the chance to spend more time in our gardens at last.
