Speed limits

Our request to West Sussex County Council (WSCC) for a reduced 40 mph speed limit along Poynings and Edburton Road is being moved forward. It is now subject to a WSCC statutory 3 week Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) consultation period which ends on the 12 September 2024.
