

Parish Council News by Mark Hind, Chair of Fulking Parish Council (FPC)

Speed limits Our request to West Sussex County Council (WSCC) for a reduced 40 mph speed limit along Poynings and Edburton Road has now been approved. We hope the new signage will be in place early next year.

Village Signs Two of the three signs have now been restored and replaced. The other sign is also being restored and will be replaced soon.

RAM Pump Roof Replacement of the RAM pump roof will require approval of Historic England and the SDNPA. We are now investigating options including repair or replacement, together with the approval process and quotations for its repair or restoration.

Planning Inspector Appeal The recent application for one gypsy pitch at Small Acres was rejected by the South Downs National Park Authority in September. An appeal has been lodged with the Planning Inspectorate and the closing date for representations is 11 December
